Please bring a bag to take home library books and Home/School activity books. It is useful for children to get into the habit of bringing their bag each day. We have Harbertonford book bags available to buy in school for £4.50.

Home/School Activities

We encourage children to talk to you about their learning, by sending home activities to practise skills at home. These are voluntary activities which the children usually enjoy.

Uniform

Girls: Grey/Navy skirt, pinafore or trousers. White/blue polo shirt or blouse. School cardigan or sweatshirt. Dark shoes.

Boys: Grey/Navy trousers.

White/blue polo or short sleeved shirt. School sweatshirt. Dark shoes.

It is essential that all clothing is clearly labelled with your child's name.

Just in case of accidents, please send in spare clothes (nonuniform) for your child.

P.E. Bag

The children need to bring a named bag with named navy blue shorts and plimsolls. We also have a red Harbertonford P.E. T-shirt.

In the summer they will need a named swimming bag (Harbertonford School swimming/P.E. bags also available from school), with towel and costume. A named sunhat and sun cream are also advisable for swimming and break times.

School dinners

We provide lovely, hot dinners, vegetarian dinners and salads. Alternatively the children may bring a packed lunch from home. Key stage 1 (Reception, Years 1 & 2) receive free school meals. The meals are freshly cooked onsite and currently cost £2.50 for years 3, 4, 5 & 6.

Snacks

The children are given a free piece of fruit or vegetable every day. They may bring an additional snack and drink if they would like to. No sweets or fizzy drinks please!

Medicines

Please inform us of any medication your child needs to take. A form will need to be completed for some medicines. This must be kept in the office and be labelled with their name. Head lice are regular visitors! Please help by checking your child's hair regularly.
